## THE BCBSIL FORMULARY: A REFERENCE FOR YOU AND YOUR DOCTOR

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Illinois (BCBSIL) is pleased to provide the 2012 Drug Formulary. The BCBSIL formulary is a list of preferred drugs considered to be safe and cost-effective.

**Formulary Updates** – The BCBSIL formulary is regularly updated as generic drugs become available and changes take place in the pharmaceuticals market. For the most up-to-date information, visit [www.bcbsil.com](http://www.bcbsil.com) and log on to Blue Access® for Members or call the Pharmacy Program number on the back of your ID card.

### HOW FORMULARY DRUGS ARE SELECTED

Formulary drugs are selected by BCBSIL based upon the recommendations of a committee, which is made up of current and previously practicing physicians and pharmacists from across the country, some of whom are employed by or affiliated with BCBSIL.

The committee considers drugs regulated by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for inclusion on the formulary. As part of the process, the committee reviews data from clinical studies, published literature and opinions from experts who are not part of the committee. Some of the factors committee members evaluate include each drug's safety, effectiveness, cost and how it compares with drugs currently on the formulary.

The committee considers drugs that are newly approved by the FDA, as well as those that have been on the market for some time. Entire drug classes are also regularly reviewed.

### GENERIC DRUGS

As with brand drugs, generic drugs are reviewed and regulated by the FDA.

There are two types of generic drugs:

- A **generic equivalent** is made with the same active ingredient at the same strength as the reference brand drug. You can expect the same results as with the brand counterpart.
- A **generic alternative** is a drug used to treat the same condition. The active ingredient in a generic alternative differs from the brand drug. The drugs may be therapeutically similar in treating a condition, but not equivalent – overall results may vary.

#### Generic Equivalents

According to the FDA, compared to its brand counterpart, a generic equivalent:

- has the same active ingredients
- works the same in the body
- is as safe and effective
- meets the same standards set by the FDA

The main difference between the reference brand drug and the generic equivalent is that the generic often costs much less. The manufacturer of a generic drug does not have to recover the costs of years of clinical research and development for the drug since this has been done by the brand drug's manufacturer. This means you pay less out-of-pocket for the medication.

#### Consider Talking to Your Doctor About Generic Drugs

If your doctor writes a prescription for a brand drug that does not have a generic equivalent, consider asking if an appropriate generic alternative is available.

You can also let your pharmacist know that you would like a generic equivalent for a brand drug, whenever one is available. Your pharmacist can usually substitute a generic equivalent for its brand counterpart without a new prescription from your doctor.

Only your doctor can determine whether a generic alternative is right for you and must prescribe the medication.

### ADVANTAGES OF REFERENCING THE FORMULARY

This formulary is organized in sections, either by drug class or medical condition. Within each section are subsections to help you more quickly locate particular medications and their formulary status.

Your payment amount for covered formulary drugs is usually lower than for non-formulary drugs. You have benefits for most covered medications that are not on the formulary, but you may have to pay more out-of-pocket.

**Please note:** All generic medications are included on the formulary, but not all generic medications are listed in this formulary. All formulary brand drugs are listed on the following pages.

### COVERAGE CONSIDERATIONS

Most benefit plans provide coverage for up to a 34-day supply of medication, with some exceptions. Your prescription drug benefit plan may also provide coverage for up to a 90-day supply of maintenance medications. Maintenance medications are those drugs you take on an ongoing basis for conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes or high cholesterol.

**Dispensing Limits:** Your prescription drug plan includes coverage limits on certain medications. These limits are in accordance with generally accepted pharmaceutical and manufacturers' guidelines. Drug dispensing limits help encourage medication use as intended by the FDA.

Dispensing limits are placed on medications in certain categories. Limits may include:

- Quantity of covered medication per prescription
- Quantity of covered medication within a given time period
- Coverage only for members within a certain age range

In addition, limits may apply across multiple medications within a drug category, for example: oral fentanyl, insomnia, narcolepsy, erectile dysfunction, cystic fibrosis, and infertility products. Drug dispensing limits for your benefit plan may be different than those listed here. Note that some drug classes are excluded by some plans and therefore are not covered. Dispensing limits may vary depending on state regulations. Some drugs may not be available at mail order. If you have questions about drug dispensing limits or your prescription drug benefits, call the Pharmacy Program number on the back of your ID card.

In addition to the standard dispensing limits, a 30-day supply limit applies to all specialty and select non-specialty medications. Only a one-month supply of these medications can be filled at one time. The following drug categories are select examples of medications with a 30-day supply limit:

- Anticoagulants
- Blood Modifiers
- Cystic Fibrosis Drugs
- Drugs with Limited Distribution
- Growth Hormones
- Hemophilia Drugs
- Hepatitis Drugs
- Infertility Drugs
- Multiple Sclerosis Drugs
- Oral Chemotherapy Drugs
- Prostate Cancer Drugs
- Rheumatoid Arthritis Drugs

This list is not comprehensive and is subject to change.

**Prior Authorization:** Depending on your benefit plan, certain drugs may require prior authorization. This means that your doctor must submit a prior authorization request in order for a prescription for these medications to be considered for coverage.

**Over-the-Counter Exclusions:** Some benefit plans do not provide coverage for prescription medications that have an over-the-counter version. You should refer to your benefit plan booklet for details about your particular benefits.

**Compounded Medications:** Depending on your benefit plan, compounded medications are in the Tier 3 payment level – non-formulary brand.

**Repackaged Medications:** Repackaged medications are repackaged versions of medications already available on the market. Repackaged medications are not covered.

**Remember, medication decisions are between you and your doctor.** Only your doctor can determine whether a formulary medication is right for you. Discuss any questions or concerns you have about medications you are taking or are prescribed with your doctor.

## SPECIALTY PHARMACY PROGRAM

Specialty drugs are used in the treatment of medical conditions such as hepatitis, hemophilia, multiple sclerosis, and rheumatoid arthritis. Specialty drugs can be oral or injectable medications that can either be self-administered or administered by a healthcare professional. Note that some drug classes are excluded by some plans and therefore are not covered. Your benefit may have a different coverage level for specialty drugs. If you have questions about specialty pharmacy benefit or your prescription drug benefits, call the Pharmacy Program number on the back of your ID card.

### Triessent\* Specialty Pharmacy Program

Through Triessent, members can have covered specialty medications delivered directly to them or their doctor's office. When you purchase specialty medications through Triessent, you also receive at no additional charge the following services:

- Coordination of coverage between you, your doctor and Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Illinois
- Educational materials about your particular condition and information about managing potential medication side effects
- Syringes, sharps containers and other supplies with every shipment for self-injectables
- 24/7/365 phone access to a pharmacist for urgent medication issues

## HOW TO USE THE FORMULARY

### Formulary Product Descriptions

Generic drugs are listed in lowercase bold type, followed by their reference brand drug (in parentheses). Generic drugs are Tier 1 payment level. The reference brand drug is Tier 3 payment level – non-formulary brand. Tier 3 drugs are included in this formulary only as reference brands.

Example: **atenolol** (Tenormin)

Brand drugs are listed in all CAPITAL letters, followed by the generic name. Brand drugs listed in the formulary are all Tier 2 – formulary brand drugs – and have no generic equivalent drug available.

Example: CRESTOR – rosuvastatin

### Specific Strengths and Dosage Forms

The following examples are given to assist you and your doctor in reading formulary listings that include specific strengths and dosage forms. These examples can be applied to other drugs on the formulary. Any exceptions are noted in the drug list and some listings contain additional information about specific products or dosage forms.

- **Modified-release or combination products on the formulary are defined by the noted brand product.**

Example: **enalapril/hydrochlorothiazide** (Vaseretic)

Only generic versions of Vaseretic are on the formulary; the brand version is not on the formulary.

- **Extended-release and delayed-release products require their own entry.**

Example: Detrol LA – tolterodine ext-release

The long-acting product Detrol LA is on the formulary, but requires a separate entry from the non ext-release product Detrol.

### Drugs Used to Treat Multiple Conditions

Some drugs in the same dosage form may be used to treat more than one medical condition. In this formulary, each medication is classified according to its first FDA-approved use. Please check the index if you do not find your particular medication in the class/condition section that corresponds to your use.
